Allen Mark Hansen, age 53, beloved father, brother, son and friend, passed away peacefully April 6, 2025 at home in Santaquin, Utah.

Allen was born October 13, 1971 in Salt Lake City, Utah to Jo Bert Hansen and Connie Spanton Hansen. He grew up in Payson, Utah where he found a love for hunting, fishing, water and snow skiing, and all things outdoors.

Allen graduated from Payson High School with the class of 1990. Throughout his life, Allen was a devout member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He served a mission in the Oklahoma City, Oklahoma mission and maintained lifelong friendships from his time there.

On his days off, he enjoyed supporting the students he worked with, attending their athletic events and cheering them on during their games. He cherished his time at his jobs and the friendships he made with colleagues.

Allen had a special affinity for keeping things clean and well-maintained. Whether it was his home, his car, or his tools, he took great pride in caring for the things that mattered to him. His meticulous nature and commitment to organization were passed down to his sons, who learned from him the importance of taking care of their belongings and keeping things in order.
