Santaquin City Library was established a little over 20 years ago in its current building. Santaquin is a small, rural city that has been expanding in the last 3 years. Currently the population is 20,000 and continuing to grow with young families. We are a community where knowledge and literacy is valued.

Plan Objectives

This plan is intended to guide technological development in the library for the next three years. By assessing library industry standards and updating existing technology, identifying training for staff and expanding services and equipment, we are able to grow with the needs of our community while planning for these needs within our budget.

Technology Goals

- The library director will assess hardware, software and network requirements and include city and IT as necessary for any updates needed to meet Utah State Library standards and library industry needs. This will help us develop a rotation schedule and needs assessment for new and existing technology. These will be included in yearly fiscal budgeting requests for city council review and approval.
- Continue to be an active member of the Beehive Library Consortium/Overdrive/Libby
 and digital collections provided by the Utah State Library. As Santaquin's population
 grows and usage of these collections increases, so does the cost to be a member.
 Assess amount for yearly fiscal budgeting for city council to review and approve as
 needed. This will also include any new technology that may become available through
 the Utah State Library that might benefit our community and meet library industry
 standards.
- The library will provide well-trained staff to provide patron assistance on technologies that we provide and any staff facing programs necessary to their jobs. The library director will assign staff training monthly and be available for training help as necessary,

either personally or assigning someone on staff to train. This will also include training and updating processes by staff to online and more efficient technologies as they become available, such as how our systems, self checkout, Google docs, ILS ticketing, etc. works. Bringing all staff up to date on current technology.

 The library director will stay up to date on the newest technologies that would benefit patrons and staff. These will be acquired as necessary through applying for grants available or fiscal budgeting where applicable, always keeping the communities best interest and needs in mind.

<u>Summary</u>

Santaquin City Library aims to empower and enhance the community through current and relevant technology, while promoting intellectual freedom, digital equity, and educational growth. The library has developed a three-year plan to guide technological development with flexibility. This includes assessing and updating existing technology, providing training for staff, and expanding services and equipment within the budget.
