BE IT RESOLVED, the Santaquin City Council herby requests recertification of the Santaquin Justice Court by the Justice Courts Standards Committee and the Utah Judicial Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council of Santaquin City herby affirm their willingness to continue to meet all requirements set forth by the Judicial Council for continued operation of the Santaquin Justice Court for the next four-year term of court, except as to any requirements waived by the Utah Judicial Council.
